Bounty Hot Chocolate

20 ml Coconut Syrup (Available in most coffee shops or online at Antilles Coffee)
 1 large tablespoon chocolate drinking powder
 Milk (skim, lite or full cream) and an optional tablespoon of coconut cream
 whipped cream, coconut flakes and chocolate powder to garnish

The How To:

Warm up a mug by filling it with hot water from the kettle.

Empty out the water (leave a tablespoon in) and put in the chocolate powder and syrup, stir to dissolve.

If you have a microwave safe plunger, fill it half way with milk and heat (don't boil).

Plunge the milk until foam appears and tip into the chocolate mixture.

Garnish with cream and coconut flakes, dust with chocolate powder.

WINGHAM BEEF WEEK

During Week 4, the McCarthy show team attended Wingham Beef Week. Tuesday was an education day where seminars related to meat quality, marketing options, pasture species, and new diseases impacting the beef industry. On Wednesday paraders' competitions were held with over 300 competitors, who are judged on how well they present the animal and on their own presentation and professionalism. Sharna Coleman made it through to the finals out of the 120 competitors in her age. Billy McNaughton impressed the judges with his style, class and calm approach to his misbehaving animal, also made the finals in the junior age group. Kate Spencer also made the finals of her age group. The day concluded with a presentation from Meat Standards Australia.

McCarthy had five steers in the Hoof competition on Thursday, representing four months after school work in order to have them ready to show. "General" placed 1st in the light weight unled and was named "Reserve Champion Unled Steer". "Leroy" placed 3rd in a tough middle weight unled class, while "Jinx" placed 2nd in his class. "Roadie" and "Cash" were out classed on the day. On Friday, the carcass judging competition assessed the meat quality of the carcass. Competitors are able to enter the abattoirs, view the processing chain and see the steers hanging in the chiller. Students had to identify the carcasses and rank them based on the amount of muscle, fat score and meat quality traits. "Jinx" placed 4th, "Leroy" 2nd and "General" also 2nd on the Hook.



On offer throughout the whole week was a special prize to encourage students to really commit to the agriculture industry. Students were then interviewed about their involvement in Agriculture at school and what educational value they felt they gained from their participation in show team. Jasmine Whitten impressed the interview panel throughout the week and was awarded the "Belinda Hobbs Special Encouragement Award" along with \$300 prize money.

On behalf of the team we would like to thank Mr Rob Maxwell for giving up a week of his time to drive us to the show and share his amazing knowledge of the cattle industry. We would also like to take the opportunity to say thank you to Mr Longford who very kindly donated a steer to the show team and donated the money from the sale of "Cash" back to the show team.
