Toastmasters of Tamworth offer an annual Youth Leadership course to Year 11 students. Students complete a seven week course in which they learn to effectively deliver an oral presentation. Each week the course has a slightly different focus and students are taught new skills. Lectures range from basic rules such as avoiding the words 'um' and 'ah' to how to stand, use body language and visual aids effectively.

At the conclusion of the course, the students graduate and are presented with a certificate. The Judy Woodgate Memorial Trophy is presented to the student who best demonstrates the skills they have learnt throughout the course.
