Survey

Uniform Compliance

Upon enrolment, all students and parents agree to comply with all school policies, including the published Uniform Policy, established by the School Steering Committee (a group of parents, staff and community members). The school then endeavours to ensure that uniform requirements are met by all students.

From time to time, fashion trends conflict with these requirements. However, the school uniform is not a fashion statement and does not change for trends. This has been made very clear at school assemblies, through school newsletters and, in some cases, through individual letters addressing particular issues.

Despite this, some trends continue to be a problem, in particular coloured sports shoes, canvas school shoes, ear spacers and nasal piercings. All students must understand that continued defiance of the school Uniform Policy may impact their ability to represent the school in any capacity or even, in the long term, whether the school will provide a reference.

Although the resources are indicated for use up to and including Year 8, many tips on the A-Z list could apply to all students.

Sleep is essential for learning and well-being. It is evident in classes that sleep deprivation results in reduced concentration and learning. Research shows that adolescents should:

- have 9 – 10 hours of sleep per night
- have a wind down period of 30 – 40 minutes before going to bed
- have an established routine in going to bed
- exercise earlier in the day
- close down or remove distractions from the bedroom (eg phones)
- maximise two sleeping cues (darkness in order to allow melatonin to aid sleep and normal/low body temperature)
- catch up on any missed sleep.

Year 12

On Tuesday 13 August, all Year 12 students will receive their copy of UAC 2014. This year there are significant changes in the booklet compared to recent years, but dates and costs explained at the University Information Evening remain the same. Also on

the Tuesday, there will be a meeting for all students who intend to apply to any of the Early Entry or Early Offer Schemes. Application forms and instructions will be available to students who are eligible to apply at the meeting.

Work Experience

Too often, students or parents contact me saying that Work Experience is all arranged and that the employer is asking for paperwork. Unfortunately, in this day and age, it is not a simple process. Work Experience is not compulsory and the vast majority of students do not do Work Experience, nor do they meet the criteria involved.

Please go to the Work Experience page on the school's Careers site to find out what our school policy is and what is required to apply to do Work Experience. Unfortunately some applications are denied due to the nature of the work or a lack of required qualifications. There are many forms that must be completed by the student, a parent/guardian, the employer and by the Careers Adviser for the Work Experience to meet all legal requirements of the insurance companies. This can take time and effort; and should be a carefully considered pathway.

MATHEMATICS

McCarthy has been celebrating Numeracy Week. A Mathematics problem solving puzzle has been made available to students each morning during Homeclass. Students have had until 9.00am each morning to hand in the previous day's puzzle. There has been strong participation and results will be collated and solutions given this week.

Puzzles the students worked on last week during Homeclass:

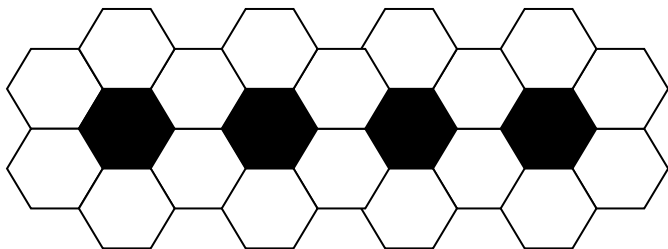
1. Chantelle and David are in a queue. Chantelle's woollen scarf catches on David's jacket. After they have seen to their business, they depart from the queue in opposite directions and the scarf begins to unravel. Chantelle is only 200 metres from home, and walks at a steady pace of 2.2 metres per second. David runs at 5 metres per second. After 15 seconds, David realises he is destroying Chantelle's scarf so, without delay, he turns around and runs back to her at 6.2 metres per second. When she hears him coming, she stops. Two seconds later, he catches up with her. How long is the piece of unravelled wool, 15 seconds after they depart the queue?
2. A farmer and his wife, with their son, daughter and dog, were going to town. They came to a river. Now the only boat available was a frail one which could not hold more than 70kg. The farmer and his wife each weighed 70kg, the son and the daughter each weighed 35kg and the dog weighs 10kg. How did they all get across the river?
3. With how few bearers can an explorer make a six day march across an absolutely barren desert if he and the available bearers each carry only enough food and water to last one man four days?
4. It takes a cyclist three minutes to ride a kilometre on level ground against the wind, but only two minutes to return with the wind behind him. How long would it take him to ride one kilometre on a calm day?
5. Find the sum when all the three digit numbers which can be made up from the digits 2, 3 and 7 are added up, e.g. 733, 222, 327.

Two groups of Year 9 students are participating in the Australian Statistics poster competition.

The Australian Mathematics Competition was held on 1 August with the ICAS Mathematics competition coming up on 13 August. It would be wonderful to see more students taking the challenge of these competitions next year. Thinking mathematically can help students in many aspects of their schooling.

A Year 7 and a Year 8 Mathematics class participated in the "The Reach for the Stars: This is Rubbish" activity. This activity was designed with the International Year of Statistics and the International Year of Mathematics of Planet Earth in mind. Their data has been added to the national collection. Students were collecting information about the range of waste generated here at McCarthy. (The average four person family generates the equivalent of a three bedroom house in waste each year).

Year 12 students are busy doing their Trial examinations and we wish them well.

SHOE REMINDER
