Improvement Agenda

McCarthy's Annual Development Plan for 2013 includes the groundwork for a major shift in academic culture in the school. A number of initiatives have already been implemented to address curriculum breadth and enhance opportunities for success for all students. Data collection and analysis is almost complete and identification of specific issues is underway. A full parent survey will be conducted in 2014, addressing specific questions relating to aspiration, study patterns and techniques, curriculum choices, attitudes, students' outside school commitments, family involvement in study and much more. This is a busy term for Year 12 students with Trial HSC exams, major works, final assessment tasks and applications for university and scholarships. Year 12 students applying to university have been given a copy of UAC 2014. Over sixty students attended the talk on Early Entry Schemes. There are different dates and deadlines that need to be adhered to. **It is each student's responsibility to do research and ensure instructions are followed and applications are in by due dates.** I will send reminders out in emails and provide information and assistance but students must take "ownership" of their future.

My advice for students is to be informed and not to leave applications to the last minute as a rushed, poorly written Early Entry or scholarship applications with spelling and punctuation errors are not well received.

University Open Days

We are now commencing the Open Day period when, over the next three to four weeks, many universities, colleges and other institutions will have Open Days on Saturdays and Sundays. This involves travel and is a chance for students and parents to see potential places where they might study for the next few years, to find out about courses, options, see facilities, ask about internships or work placement etc. Students have been notified of dates for Open Days via emails and in the UAC book.

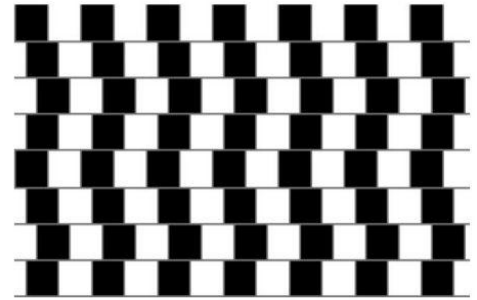

WORLD YOUTH DAY 2013 RIO



I had been preparing myself for this journey for over a year. My preparation was mostly holy but also included elements of self-exploration and physical preparedness. Once our group meetings started, one fundamental element emerged; we were all there in search of a greater connection to God. Our bond was instantaneous and with like-minded purpose, we started our pilgrimage in the naturally beautiful and the spiritually uplifting atmosphere of Argentina.

In Buenos Aires, we had the unique faith experience of Bishop Kennedy performing Mass in the Cathedral crypt. This was the church the Pope presided over when he was a Cardinal. This was a divine moment, one that will stay with me for the rest of my life.

Whilst in Argentina, we visited Iguazu Falls and experienced one of the seven

Natural Wonders of the World. It was awe-inspiring and without doubt a very significant event in our journey. We then visited the falls from the Brazilian side and once again we witnessed one of God’s great creations.

By the time we arrived in Rio for World Youth Day, the group had become one spiritually. The pace of the experience quickened as we went from the opening Mass, to the Aussie gathering, to the Papal arrival, on to the Stations of the Cross and to the pilgrim walk that led us to Copacabana Beach for the final Papal Mass. One aspect was prevalent throughout our time in Rio: the Pope was very open and caring to his fellow man.

The trip was life changing and something I will remember for the rest of my life. It has helped me reflect on who I am and what my role is in my school, church and community. Pope Francis exemplifies many of the traits needed to be a great Catholic leader but the one I most connected with was his love for his fellow man. World Youth Day Rio de Janeiro

The weekend’s activities were the climax of the week. Because of the rain that Rio had experienced, the final Mass was changed to Copacabana Beach where most of the other events were held. The pilgrim walk through the streets of Rio was wonderful, seeing so many of Rio de Janeiro’s attractions along the way. The beach and all the walkways were covered with people who were going to the Vigil and sleeping out for the final Mass the next morning, which was attended by over 3 million people!

It was a once in a lifetime experience and such a great opportunity to meet and travel with wonderful people.
