## **Reflection**

"...They called the church together and reported what God had done with them and how he had opened the door of faith..."(Acts 14:27).

In the Acts of the Apostles, we learn that God opened the door of faith for the early Church. Over the past twelve months, during the Year of Faith, God has also opened the door of faith for each one of us and invited us to step through into a deeper relationship with him. It has been an opportunity for every Catholic to turn towards Jesus Christ, encountering him in the Sacraments, especially the Eucharist and to rediscover or strengthen their faith. The Year of Faith concluded on 24 November – the Feast of Christ the King.

## **PRINCIPAL MATTERS**

### **Academic Culture**

2013 has seen a major focus on improving the academic culture of the school. This has involved considerable research, data analysis and reflection. Staff members across the school have been working to develop a number of large and small scale interventions which will be implemented over the next few years. Some significant changes have begun to be implemented and will be operating from the commencement of the new school year.

One of the changes that will be implemented from the commencement of the year is a variation to pastoral care structures. From 2014, Year Coordinators will be allocated to a Year cohort and will remain with the Year rather than the cohort. That means that Coordinators will be appointed as specialists in each age group. For example, the Year 7 and Year 12 Coordinators will be transition specialists focussing on the specific needs of students as they move into and out of secondary education.

More information about improvements will be provided early in the new year and opportunities for parent engagement in the process will be provided at various stages of implementation.

**PASTORAL CARE****Guest Speaker**

Year 10 students attended an informative and inspirational presentation by Anj Barker and her parents last week. Anj, now 26, was the victim of relationship violence at age 16. The elite sportswoman, SLC member and high achieving student was attacked by her ex-boyfriend and was considered lucky to survive. She was left with severe head injuries, was in a coma for 9 months and could not speak for 5 years. Today Anj, a recipient of the Victorian Young Australian of the Year Award, is hoping young people can learn from her experiences. Her messages included:

- If a relationship feels wrong, it most probably is.
- If your parents and friends are telling you that your partner is not good for you, then you should listen.
- No abuse, verbal or physical is acceptable.
- When in a boyfriend/girlfriend relationship, maintain your old friendships and spend some time with other people.
- Never end a relationship in an isolated place. Make sure responsible people are nearby.

To me, Anj's most inspirational message was that of the power of resilience. Through the love of her parents and friends, her positive attitude, the setting of goals and her persistence in pursuing them, Anj has achieved some amazing milestones. The students were most attentive and appreciative of the experience.

### Work Experience

There are a few keen students who are actively searching for apprenticeships and traineeships and are increasing their chances of success by doing Work Experience this term. All the instructions, including the initial application form to do Work Experience can be found on the school's website at:

There is a lot of time consuming paperwork involved which ensures Work Experience meets all the legal requirements protecting the interests of the student, employer, school and the Work Experience insurance company.

### Year 12

The universities are beginning to send out notification of successful Early Entry offers. Students whose applications have been successful, are reminded to please follow the instructions if they intend to take up the offer and do not lose the notification. December 3 is the date by which students must nominate the course for which they wish to receive an offer in the Early Round. Students are advised to do this and accept the offer made in the Early Round (December 5) and then once they get their ATAR, they may choose to make another course their first preference in order that they can possibly receive another offer in the main round in January. It is possible to get more than one offer by carefully following instructions and taking actions by certain deadlines. Not all students who apply for Early Entry are successful, with the universities making their offers based on the school's recommendations and on the competition for the number of places they put aside for Early Entry applications. Students still may be successful in gaining the ATAR required or may look at alternative pathways to university. I have a folder full of alternative pathways to university depending on what students want to do and where they want to study. Please contact me if this is required.
